

# Brooklyn's Day in the Preschool Room



## Highlights of the day:

Today, Brooklyn played for quite a while at the sand table. She did a lot of pouring from one container to the next, measuring sand to the top without spilling too much. We've been impressed with Brooklyn's hand/eye coordination. She was fascinated with the cause and effect of the sifter as she watched the sand move the wheel. She and Julia experimented with the wheel, exploring how it works. During circle time we talked about the sand. Brooklyn said the sand was "heavy, rough and hard to pick up" and estimated the weight of the sand in the bucket as "five pounds." We made a chart of what the students thought the sand weighed.
